

Abigail Golden-Vázquez, as Executive Director of the Aspen Institute Latinos and Society Program, Abigail runs a policy program whose goal is to improve understanding of the growing Latino community, its critical importance to the success of the United States and promote policies and actions that to advance Latino progress to strengthen the country. The program focuses on three critical policy levers, education, civic participation and educational attainment, and offers scholarships to increase Latino leadership and participation and important Aspen Institute fora.

For 8 years prior Abigail developed and managed the Institute's geographical (Africa, Central America, India, Middle East, and China) and topical leadership initiatives (education and environment) that comprise the Aspen Global Leadership Network with the goal of stimulating a new generation of local leaders poised to play a greater role in the civic engagement of their countries. As a Vice President at the Aspen Institute she is part of the executive management team working on strategy and representing the Institute publicly. Abigail joined the Aspen Institute from the German Marshall Fund (GMF) in 2006 where she was a senior manager and director of External Relations responsible for partnership development, congressional relations, and public outreach.

Abigail holds a B.A. in Political Science and Spanish from Amherst College and an M.A. in International Relations and Latin American Studies from the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies. She is a National Hispana Leadership Institute Executive Leadership Fellow and an International Career Advancement Program Fellow. She has attended leadership training at the Center for Creative Leadership and at Harvard Kennedy School.
