



AAHHE Publications in The Hispanic Outlook in Higher Education Magazine® Article Submission Guidelines

Heading

At the top of the first page of your article, please include your name, degree initials, email address, and day-time phone number. Indicate if you are an AAHHE member.

Audience

The Hispanic Outlook readership consists primarily of Hispanic scholars, educators, and administrators. Please keep this audience in mind when you write and focus your article.

Format

- Articles must be no longer than 1000 words, double-spaced. **Articles over 1,000* words will be cut. Articles may be edited for style and clarity. Any changes of this type are made with the reader in mind.
- Use third person when writing your article
- Times New Roman, 12 pt., with one-inch margins all around.
- Divide the article into two or three sections with headings in the articles. For example: Article title: Latinas and Graduate Education Heading 2: Latina successes Heading 3: Future trends, etc.

Example

Here's an example of a strong piece that HO Magazine decided to translate into Spanish: <u>En</u> <u>nuestras manos: The Future of Health and Health Care</u>

What HO Magazine is looking for in the Content:

- Follow the topic of the month's magazine issue.
- Editorial-style articles—not extended personal testimonials. Avoid extended testimonials.
- Articles need to include data, relevant references, and specific examples.
- Data-backed insight and focused, well-structured writing. Provide rich context with specific examples and information, include empirical data, facts and research as it is applicable to the topic.
- Timely and actionable themes: leadership, mental health, access, student success
- One or two short anecdotes may be used to support broader points.
- References: Mention references/sources to support any claims or arguments made in the article.
- Broader Relevance: Present information reflecting broader trends in Hispanic/Latino higher education. Consider offering insights that our audience might find useful—

especially around student support.

Please avoid

- Entirely personal stories without broader relevance.
- Vague or generic motivational content.
- Articles lacking focus or specificity.

Tone

- Set the editorial tone to be clear, formal, objective, research-based, and concise.
- If including a short testimonial, set the tone to be clear, and encouraging. Stories that inspire others facing similar challenges are impactful. Concrete examples of overcoming obstacles or finding resources can resonate well.

Additional Materials to be Submitted

Biography

At the end of the article, include a 40-word (max) biography.

Photos

Send two photos (in .jpeg format) separately– a professional headshot *and* a photo of something related to the article. Provide credits for the photos you send and include these credits in the body of the submission email.

Submission Process
